

New tele-radiology facility at Whitefield

Bangalore, Nov 4: CEO and Managing Director of Infosys Technologies Ltd Nandan Nilekani inaugurated the new tele-radiology facility of Tele-radiology Solutions, Radspace, here on Saturday.

Nilekani said technology had advanced and with the help of Software Technology Parks of India (STPI), Indian companies were able to reach the foreign market. Infosys has grown through the growth stage and he was aware of the challenges during that period. Infosys aims to make a three billion dollars mark in 2007, added Nilekani.

CEO and Radiologist of Teleradiology Solutions Dr Arjun Kalyanpur said the new 70,000-sq feet facility would offer tele-radiology services to hospitals around the globe, including interpretation of all non-invasive imaging studies, namely CT, MRI, ultrasound, nuclear medicine studies and digitised X-rays via tele-radiology (remote interpretation).

The center is creatively designed with unusual features such as a slide from the cafe lounge to the tennis court to create a stress-free environment.

He said the company had achieved 99.9 per cent accuracy in its results and caters to 45 hospitals in the US and two hospitals- Narayana Hrudayalaya and Columbia Asia Hospital in the city.

"We aim to reach all rural areas in the country and provide tele-radiology," added Dr Kalyanpur.

He also said that the opening of this facility would play a critical role in the rapidly evolving space of tele-medicine and is a reflection of the company's commitment to developing Bangalore as a global tele-radiology hub.

Narayana Hrudayalaya chairman Dr Devi Prasad Shetty and president of the International Society of Radiology Prof Lenny Tan were present at the function.
